


Union vs. Nonunion Earnings, by Occupation

Full-time wage and salary workers' median weekly earnings, 2012

In nearly every occupational category, union members earn more than nonunion workers. By comparing the wages of workers within occupational groups, the union difference is very clear.

Union Workers Enjoy Better Health and Pension Benefits

Union workers are more likely than their nonunion counterparts to receive health care and retirement benefits, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics. In 2014, 94 percent of union workers in private industries had access to medical care benefits, compared with only 67 percent of nonunion workers.


The Union advantage is also evident in retirement benefits. Ninety-two percent of union workers are covered by retirement benefits versus 62 percent of nonunion workers.

The Union advantage is also evident in other benefits including life insurance, paid vacation and other paid time-off.

Unions Raise Wages by more than 27 Percent

Union membership helps raise workers' pay and narrows the income gap that disadvantages women. Union workers earn 27.1 percent more than nonunion workers, according to the U.S. Department of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics. Their median weekly earnings for full-time wage and salary work were \$970 in 2014, compared with \$763 for their nonunion counterparts. On an annual basis, this \$207 per week difference in median earnings works out to an \$10,764 advantage for the Union worker.

Beyond just monetary and benefits, union workers have a say in their working conditions, hours of work, defined promotion system, safety programs and outlined grievance procedures to dispute management actions. These issues, coupled with giving a member a true voice in their workplace, are priceless.

Union Fast Facts



Median weekly earnings for Union workers' are more than 27 percent higher than their nonunion counterparts



92 percent of union workers are covered by retirement benefits compared to only 62 percent of nonunion workers.



94 percent of union workers' jobs provide health insurance benefits compared with only 67 percent of nonunion workers' jobs



86 percent of union workers receive life insurance benefits compared to only 54 percent of nonunion workers.



91 percent of union workers receive paid vacation compared to only 75 percent of nonunion workers.



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
